EASTERN MARKET COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE REGULAR MEETING MARCH 29, 2023

MINUTES

The regular meeting of the Eastern Market Community Advisory Committee (EMCAC) was held on Wednesday, March 29, 2023, at 7:00 P.M., in person and via Zoom. The Chair called the meeting to order at 7:05 P.M.

Adoption of the Agenda

The agenda was adopted as distributed.

Approval of the Minutes

The minutes of the regular meeting on February 22, 2023, were approved.

Report of the Treasurer

Mr. Kuchenberg, the Treasurer, reported a balance of \$1,097 in EMCAC's bank account, with no deposits or withdrawals.

Report of the Chair

Security Plan Review Ad Hoc Subcommittee: Ms. Krieger presented an overview of a draft report on the 2013 and 2022 security plans and requested input on the draft report by April 14, 2023.

Eastern Market 150th Anniversary Ad Hoc Subcommittee: Mr. Pate reported the following developments.

- A community stakeholder meeting was held on February 29, 2023.
- A funding application was submitted to Events DC to be awarded mid-April to pay for a schedule of events throughout the year.
- The Capitol Hill Community Foundation issued a grant to pay for the Cherry Blossom Festival decorations in the North Hall, which will remain installed through Easter.
- A local brewery will release a beer for the 150th anniversary in May.
- History-related events will begin in May.

Budget Oversight Hearing/Testimony: Mr. Edwards presented a report, which is attached to these minutes, on the capital budget for Eastern Market. Mr. Pate moved that Mr. Edwards be authorized to testify on behalf of EMCAC at the DC Council's Committee on Facilities & Family Services' budget oversight hearing on April 6, 2023, regarding Eastern Market's budget needs. The motion was adopted. By unanimous consent, the Chair was authorized to contact Councilmember Janeese Lewis George and offer a tour of Eastern Market.

Proposed Committee Structure: The Chair reported that he and Mr. Kuchenberg are discussing proposing additional committee structure for development of community involvement in the following areas: fundraising, event planning, marketing/branding, and social media.

Formation of a 501(c)(3)/Registration of Logo: The Chair reported that (1) he is receiving assistance to investigate the formation a 501(c)(3) and its structure and (2) a meeting was held with DGS regarding the registration of a logo.

Report of the Market Manager

Mr. Barry Margeson, Market Manager, presented a written report of the Market Manager, which is attached to these minutes. He agreed to investigate what the southern boundary of the Eastern Market Special Use Area is in the vicinity of 7th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue SE.

Report of the Tenants Council

Anita Jefferson, Chair of the Tenants Council, reported the following items: Mr. Margeson presented information on the Eastern Market 150th Anniversary planning and the management of the street, including its opening and closing, the Tenants Council had concerns on the incorporation of the outside market in the anniversary planning, suggested that the "Market Day" on May 19, 2023, be renamed "Community Day" and include Saturday, made other suggestions about the content and size of banners, prioritization of events based on amount of funding achieved, and planning for year-round events and marketing, and discussed how to get needed information from Marketspread as well as the broken windows at Eastern Market.

Report Concerning Capital Budget

March 28, 2023

The Eastern Market capital budget now before Council provides \$660,667 for FY 24 and zero dollars for FY25-29. The Eastern Market budget that DGS presented to EMCAC proposed \$2,412,886 for FY23-FY28 (with no adjustments for EMCAC's comments and zero dollars for FY29). We need to ask Council to provide \$1,087,784 additional capital budget dollars for Eastern Market for FY25-29.

The Eastern Market budget will be reviewed by Councilmember Janesse George on April 6. Since this is Councilmember George's first hearing involving Eastern Market, we will have to explain EMCAC's role in the budget process. At the hearing, EMCAC needs to present testimony about the amount and justification for increasing the budget.

One of the most important changes over this period was the determination that the HVAC project would cost about \$800,000 more than expected for the replacement of fan, pump and valve controllers. In the current HVAC project, the contractor is replacing all of the controllers that have failed but have identified other controllers that are nearing the end of their service life and should be replaced over the next five years. Preemptive replacement of these controller is essential to insure the continued operation of the new HVAC system. Attached is Cinnovasa /Southland's October 12, 2022 letter explaining the need for the replacement.

Barry has reworked the Budget to spread the controller replacement over FY2024 and FY2025 and determined work needs be done through FY2029 - a total of \$1,748,461:

The priorities for replacing the controllers cannot be determined until the new HVAC system is started up this summer, but they will not need to be replaced all at once, and thus the cos is spread over tow years: FY24 and FY25. The Farmers Shed electrical outlets are used consistently, weekend after weekend by Eastern Market's small businesses. This work will cost \$205,000 in FY26. In FY27, the Market should concern itself with a variety of small capital projects that total \$80,000. Most of these projects were highlighted in the Facilities Conditions Assessment (FCA) Report and then confirmed as critical. In FY28, the FCA calls for the replacement of two hot water pumps and FY 2029 adderesses regrouting of the exterior historical bricks, both projects confirmed as important in five years. No projects are required in FY29

currently. The total amount of capital funding required for FY24 through FY29 is \$1,748,461, an increase of \$1,087,784 over the \$660,667 currently in the budget before Council

Updates:

- All fan coil units are in place: Both offices, basement pottery studio;

- Chiller:
 - Control board was shipped;
 - I Beams for condensing units are on the roof being fitted;
 - Three chiller units will arrive on Friday;

 - Scheduled to be operational on April 24;
 - Power monitoring system will come later;
